RACE RULES

1. ORGANIZATION AND INFORMATION

The organization of the "Cinisello Balsamo Running Festival", at its 6th edition, is managed by Impossible Target Asd, in collaboration with the Municipality of Cinisello Balsamo (MI), IUTA, Civil Protection Cinisello Balsamo, and Club Super Marathon Italy.

For the year 2026, the event is the GOMU 48 HOURS WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP (5th edition), ITALIAN CHAMPIONSHIP IUTA 48 HOURS, and ITALIAN CHAMPIONSHIP IUTA 12 HOURS on the Road.

The 12-hour, 24-hour, and 48-hour races are part of the 24th Grand Prix IUTA 2026 of Ultramarathon and are included in the National Calendar IUTA 2026 of Ultramarathon. The 6-hour race remains under evaluation, at the discretion of the Organization.

2. PARTICIPATION

The Cinisello Balsamo Running Festival is recognized by the Italian Athletics Federation.

Registered athletes in Italy

According to the provisions of the "Rules for the organization of events" issued by FIDAL, athletes registered in Italy can participate limited to those aged 20 and above (year of birth) who possess one of the following requirements:

- ✓ Italian and foreign athletes registered with clubs regularly affiliated to FIDAL for the year 2026 and belonging to the following categories: Promises m/f, Seniors m/f (from SM-SF 23 to SF-SM 95 and beyond);
- ✓ Athletes in possession of a Runcard (valid as sports insurance and permission to compete), limited to individuals aged 20 and above. Participation is nonetheless subject to the submission of a medical certificate of competitive suitability specific to athletics, which must be valid and presented in original format to the organizers, with a copy retained in the records of the organizing Society for each event. The medical certificate for non-resident foreigners can be issued in their own country, but the same tests required by Italian regulations must have been carried out: a) medical examination; b) complete urine analysis; c) resting and exertion electrocardiogram; d) spirometry.
- ✓ Athletes registered with a Sports Promotion Agency (Athletics Section), in possession of a Runcard-EPS; participation is nevertheless subject, in addition to having the "RUNCARD", to the presentation of a medical certificate of competitive fitness specific to athletics, which must be valid and presented to the organizers in original format and retained, in copy, in the records of the organizing Society of each event. The medical certificate for non-resident foreigners can be issued in their own country, but the same tests required by Italian regulations must have been performed: a) medical examination; b) complete urine test; c) resting electrocardiogram and after exercise; d) spirometry.

Athletes registered outside of Italy

Italian and foreign athletes not registered in Italy can participate, limited to persons aged 20 years and above (to the nearest year) who meet one of the following requirements:

- ✓ Italian athletes, residing and registered abroad: they must present the authorization from their foreign Federation and their Club;
- ✓ foreign athletes registered with foreign athletics federations (affiliated with WA - World Athletics, International Athletics Federation);





- ✓ foreign athletes, NOT registered with foreign athletics federations: they must obtain the 'Runcard' and present a certificate issued in their own country (a specific model is available on our website), which includes the same tests required by Italian law: a) medical examination; b) complete urine analysis; c) resting and exercise electrocardiogram; d) spirometry;
- ✓ foreign athletes holding a "Runcard" with an Italian medical certificate, or with a competitive medical certificate issued in their home country while complying with Italian regulations. <https://attivita.fidal.it/content/Non-Stadia/95664>

Please remember that the RUNCARD costs €30.00 and must be requested by the athlete personally on the website www.runcard.com.
The acceptance of registrations from Russian and Belarusian athletes will be subject to the IOC rules in force at the date of the event.

ENTRY TO ITALY - VISA

It is recommended to check in advance, and before registration, the possibility of access to Italian territory based on the country of origin and the existence of any restrictive measures (for more information, it is advisable to visit the website of the Ministry of Health, www.salute.gov.it and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, www.esteri.it

Any foreign visitor who wishes to visit Italy must possess a valid passport or a valid European Union identity card. Holders of valid Schengen visas can freely enter Italy without an additional Italian visa.

The following countries require visas to enter Italy: Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Kosovo, Russia, Turkey.

These federations must contact FIDAL (internationaldept@fidal.it) well in advance and send a list of participants, containing the names and passport details (date of birth, date of issue, and expiration date) of all individuals who may be part of the team arriving in Italy.

3. REGISTRATIONS

Online by March 25, 2026 through the official website of Impossible Target Asd <https://www.impossibletarget.it/>

Necessary documents for enrollment

- ✓ registration form (automatically provided by the registration site);
- ✓ photocopy of the FIDAL electronic card, valid on the day of the race;
- ✓ photocopy of the competitive medical certificate (valid on the day of the race);

At the time of registration, each athlete must declare which race they intend to participate in (12 hours, 24 hours, 48 hours).

The athletes registered for the 48 hours race will be automatically registered for the GOMU 48-hour World Championship and, if they are IUTA members, for the IUTA 48-hour Italian Championship, at no additional cost. The Organization suggests proceeding with IUTA membership, if not already a member, in order to be included in the IUTA ranking.

At the time of registration, the athlete is required to confirm whether or not they need personal assistance. The costs are described in the appropriate section.

It is also required, at the time of registration, to fill out and countersign the following documents requested by the GOMU Regulation.:

- ✓ Athlete Code of Conduct Waiver
- ✓ Shoe Declaration Form

It is possible to register on-site, on the day of the event, with an additional fee of €10,00 on the last entry fee for the relevant race, as long as the athlete complies with the current membership regulations.

Cancellation or Event Rescheduling

L'evento si svolgerà indipendentemente dalle condizioni metereologiche.

In case of cancellation or postponement of the event date due to force majeure, such as health emergencies, natural disasters, fires, declared and undeclared wars, strikes, or decisions by the competent authorities, the registration fee will be automatically transferred to the next edition, scheduled for 2027. In case of withdrawal by the athlete for personal and documentable reasons, a 50% refund of the fee will be processed until January 15, 2026. After this date, no refund will be issued.

5. MICROCHIP

The timing is provided by TimingRun, with disposable chips.

The event will be followed in live streaming with continuous live video for the entire 48 hours. Spectators will be allowed to follow the performances of the ultramarathon runners in real time through the live streaming.

6. RACE CIRCUIT

The races take place on a mixed circuit including part of an athletics track. The route will start and pass through the Gaetano Scirea Stadium at Via Francesco Cilea 50, 20092 Cinisello Balsamo. The circuit, with international certification, measures 1400 meters.

8. AGENDA AND SCHEDULE

Program for Thursday, March 26, 2026

5:30 PM: Opening ceremony of the 48-hour GOMU World Championship with a parade of the participating nations followed by refreshments, at the Sports Hall, PalaAllende, Via XXV Aprile 3, 20092, Cinisello Balsamo.

Program of Friday, March 27, 2026

09:00 AM: meeting and welcome of the 48-hour athletes at Campo Sportivo Scirea in Via Cilea 50 for race package pickup.

11:30 AM: roll call of the 48-hour athletes and positioning in the grid.

12:00 PM: start of the 48-hour race.

Program of Saturday March 28, 2026

08:00 AM: meeting and welcome of the 24-hour athletes at the Campo Sportivo Scirea in Via Cilea 50 for the race packet pickup.

09:30 AM: roll call for the 24-hour athletes and positioning in the grid.

10:00 AM: start of the 24-hour race.

07:30 PM: meeting and welcome of the 12-hour athletes at the Campo Sportivo Scirea in Via Cilea 50 for the race packet pickup and roll call for the 12-hour athletes and positioning in the grid.

09:00 PM: start of the 12-hour race.

Program of Sunday March 29, 2026

10:00 AM: conclusion of the 12-hour race. Following this, after 10:00 AM, Awards Ceremony for the Race and Awards for the Italian Iuta Championship for the 12-hour event.

11:00 AM: conclusion of the 24-hour race. Following this, after 11:00 AM, Awards Ceremony for the Race.

1:00 PM: conclusion of the 48-hour race.

2:00 PM: Awards for the Races and Awards for the 48-hour GOMU World Championship and the Italian Iuta 48-hour Championship.

3:00 PM: Closing Ceremony of the GOMU 48-hour World Championship.

The switch to daylight saving time in Italy in 2026 will take place during the night between Saturday, March 28 and Sunday, March 29. As usual, the clocks will need to be moved forward one hour, from 2:00 AM to 3:00 AM, so all races will end an hour later to respect the correct race times.

Before the start of each race, during the roll call, a pre-race briefing will be held, covering the most relevant topics, including the location of the ambulance, the method of measuring the distance covered in the last lap in circuit races, etc.

9. RACE BAG PACK PICK UP

The race pack is provided for all races of 12 hours, 24 hours, and 48 hours. The race pack will be collected before the start of each race, upon collecting the race number. The specific contents of the race pack will be made public through a press release.

During the collection of race numbers, athletes will be required to fill out the "Shoe Declaration Form."

Athletes' strictly personal stations will be located in the athletes' neutralization area and will be covered with gazebos open on the sides and located on the outer edge of the race course.





10. REFRESHMENT

The Organization provides a specific area dedicated to a continuous buffet refreshment for the 48-hour athletes. The refreshment area for the 48-hour athletes will be specially marked, and crew members will only have access to the area if they wear an identification bracelet, to assist the competing athlete. This bracelet can be purchased for €30,00 per day, to be paid at the time of registration through the portal. In addition to the access to the buffet refreshment area, this fee also grants access to the race field and the neutralization zone of the 48-hour competition.

For all other races, of 12 hours and 24 hours, another refreshment area will be designated.

At the time of registration, it is also required to specify any allergies and/or intolerances and any diets followed.

There will be a gluten-free, vegan, and vegetarian station.

There will be a Bar service available for a fee, managed by the Civil Protection of Cinisello Balsamo..

11. RESULTS - MEASUREMENT AND UPDATES

Every athlete will be equipped with an electronic microchip, which will allow for the timing of each lap of the course to be recorded. This recording will be subject to verification by the FIDAL Race Judge. Regarding the three Ultramarathon races, each athlete will have counted the whole laps of the circuit completed, as well as any part of the lap not finished, which is in progress at the end of their race. To allow for this recording, about half an hour before the end of the races, athletes will be provided with a specific numbered tag, which must be left at the exact point on the track reached at the twelfth/twenty-fourth/forty-eighth hour (there will be an audible signal marking the completion of the twelfth/twenty-fourth/forty-eighth hour), under the close supervision of the Race Judges. The total will be rounded down to the nearest whole meter.

As required by the FIDAL/IUTA regulations for ultramarathons, only results exceeding 42.195 km will be accepted in the rankings. A display with updates of the partial results for each race will be available at the Organizational Secretariat.

12. SERVICES DURING THE COMPETITION

Neutralization area marked, with personal space identified and spaced for each athlete competing in the 12 hours, 24 hours, 48 hours, and for their accompanying crew, located within the area of the Campo Sportivo Gaetano Scirea Sports;

Toilets and showers inside the Campo Sportivo Gaetano Scirea, sanitized by the Organization;

Hot meals for each athlete competing will be served directly at the athlete's reserved area within the Neutralization Zone,

Mobile MEDICAL ASSISTANCE service and FIRST AID assistance with a defibrillator on board;

13. PERSONAL SUPPLIES

Athletes will be able to deposit their personal supplies and those provided by the Organization exclusively in **their personal area within the Neutralization Zone**.

These strictly personal stations will be located in the area of the neutralization reserved for athletes and will be covered with **gazebos** open on the sides and located on the outer edge of the race course.

The support staff can assist their runner with refreshments, changing clothes, and shoes only in their personal neutralization area. Only volunteers from the Organization are allowed to assist athletes directly in the main Refreshment area. **Basic medical support** is also permitted in one's personal area, such as treatment for small injuries, blisters, massages, etc. The Organization provides designated **areas with cots** to allow athletes in the race to rest. This service is not available for companions, who can rely on local hotels and B&Bs.

14. WITHDRAWAL FROM THE COMPETITION

A competitor may withdraw from the competition if ordered by a qualified competition medical officer or an identified member of the medical staff, or if there is medical intervention through intravenous infusion (IV) as indicated by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) Rules. The medical officer holds final authority.





15. OTHER RULES

The **chip** must be secured before entering the start area (following the provided instructions) and should not be returned at the end of the event, but recycled in the designated containers.

Clothing must comply with the International Technical Regulations. Changing clothes during the race is allowed, with the obligation to keep the bibs clearly displayed. Offensive images or texts, including insults, hate speech, discriminatory messages, and sexually explicit content, are not allowed. Male athletes must wear a t-shirt, a crop top, a tank top, or a sports shirt at all times during the race. Competing shirtless is prohibited. Female athletes may compete wearing crop tops, sports shirts, sports bras, and athletic clothing.

During the Opening Ceremony and the Parade of national teams, athletes are encouraged to wear outfits featuring the colors of their country's flags and emblems to visually enhance national identity and pride.

The **Service Doctor** is the only person authorized to enter the competition circuit in case of an athlete injury. The Service Doctor will decide what treatments are required for the athlete and may impose the withdrawal of the athlete if deemed necessary. Each athlete may be accompanied by **only one assistant**, who cannot stay on the competition circuit and may only approach the athlete in the Personal Area of the Neutral Zone. It is not mandatory to give way in the event of an **overtaking**.

Rest stops are permitted exclusively within the Personal Area in the Neutralization Zone or in the facilities provided by the Organization;

Leaving the circuit for other unauthorized reasons will result in disqualification;

Athletes are required to dispose of **waste**, cups, etc., in the designated containers provided (with disqualification from the race in case of littering along the route); Competitors may use **portable audio devices**, including **music** played from mobile phones, during GOMU races as long as safety for all is not compromised.

Athletes are allowed to use their own **phones** during GOMU competitions, provided they maintain safety. However, all phone communications must be limited to personal, non-competitive matters. "**Spirit of Competition**": Athletes must follow the spirit of competition and fair play by avoiding receiving information that would give them a competitive advantage. Respect your fellow athletes by practicing integrity and good sportsmanship.

Pacing in a 48-hour race: according to IAU rules for a 48-hour race, "pacing" refers to the act of running alongside an athlete for an extended period, step by step ("making pace"). Men cannot pace women, and women cannot pace men during the competition as they participate in separate events. Additionally, athletes entered in other concurrent events are also considered in a different event and cannot "pace" participants in the 48-hour GOMU World Championship.

As far as not provided in this regulation, the WA-IAU-IUTA and FIDAL PROCEDURES (ANTI-DOPING AND COMPLAINTS) regulations apply.

16. ANTI-DOPING

GOMU requires doping tests to be carried out for all GOMU Standard World Records, to protect the athlete's reputation from potential scrutiny.

If an athlete intends to break a world record (WR) or achieve a world-level performance (WBP), it is essential for the athlete to be registered with their national federation. This registration ensures eligibility for the necessary doping tests.

Athletes are responsible for contacting their National Federation before the event, as they will provide clear guidance on the specific procedures to follow, including any costs. Athletes may also be responsible for paying the doping test fee and should be aware of their national federation's doping requirements.

Moreover, athletes must inform the race director of the Local Organizing Committee (LOC). This communication is essential to allow the race director to notify the local anti-doping authority and arrange an appointment for testing.

The Local Organizing Committee will organize anti-doping controls in collaboration with FIDAL by the end of the event. A certified anti-doping official will be appointed in a timely manner, and the Organizing Committee will provide appropriate facilities to conduct the anti-doping control.

Athletes selected for anti-doping tests for a world record (WR) or a better world performance (WBP) must be informed by the competition director immediately after finishing. They must report to the Doping Control within 24 hours of its opening, accompanied and supervised by Anti-doping Stewards. If no anti-doping test was conducted immediately after the race, the athlete must request one from the National Anti-Doping Agency within 24 hours.

Athletes who refuse to undergo anti-doping tests or test positive will be disqualified.

Any other directives according to the provisions of W.A., FIDAL, CONI, and WADA rules.





17. COMPLAINTS

Appeals are not permitted, but if absolutely necessary, they must be presented initially in verbal form to the Jury Referee, within 30 minutes of the official announcement of the result of that event; second-instance appeals must be submitted to the Appeals Jury in writing (form available at the Organizing Secretariat), within 30 minutes of the official announcement of the Referee's decision, accompanied by a federal fee of 100 Euros.

18. CLASSIFICATIONS AND AWARDS

To all participants: race pack
For all finishers: medal

The top 3 male and top 3 female finishers will be awarded for each race and for each category, according to the IAU Rules. **These awards are also open to non-IUTA members.**

For the IUTA Italian Championship 2026 of 12 hours and 48 hours, the top first 3 IUTA athletes of both genders will be awarded medals, and the 1st place will also receive a jersey; the 1st male and female IUTA athlete in each FIDAL category will receive a jersey and a medal. The IUTA categories are defined at this link: [Norme per Organizzatori di Campionati Italiani IUTA di U-M 2026 - IUTA Italia](#)
Intermediate milestones of 24 hours at the exact hour, and of 50 and 100 miles upon surpassing these distances, will be recognized.

For the 48 Hour GOMU World Championship, the top 3 men and top 3 women will be awarded, alongside categories from both divisions, male and female. The age categories will be as follows: 25-29, 30-34, 35-39, 40-44, 45-49, 50-54, 55-59, 60-64, 65-69, 70-74, 75-79, 80-84, 85-89. The age category is determined by the athlete's age on the day the competition starts. National teams will also be awarded, separated by gender; mixed teams are not allowed. Unisex teams will consist of a minimum of two women or two men, with a maximum of eight members. Only the top two athletes of each gender will receive a GOMU national team medal, while the remaining six team members will receive a national team certificate. The Organization will recognize participation certificates for the other members of each national team and trophies for the top 3 overall teams, both male and female.

Intermediate passages of 12 hours, 24 hours, and 100 miles will be recognized.

Personal data will not be shared with third parties for purposes not permitted by law or for purposes not in accordance with this notice. Furthermore, data may be communicated to law enforcement or the judiciary in accordance with the law and upon formal request by such parties. Data may be disclosed by Impossible Target ASD in the event that it reasonably believes that disclosure is necessary to enforce its legal notices, privacy policy, and Cookie regulations, or to protect its operations or users. In the case of corporate reorganization, Impossible Target ASD may transfer all personal data collected to third parties involved in such operations, for the specific purposes for which you have given consent. In all these cases, consent is not required. Personal data may be transferred abroad only for purposes strictly related to the use of the websites and our informational services and for events organized by the Association, and only for the purpose for which they were obtained.

5. What happens if the User does not provide their personal data.

The communication of certain personal data to Impossible Target ASD such as, by way of non-exhaustive example, personal data, email address, postal address, and phone number is necessary for receiving organizational, logistical, and promotional information related to the events to which the user subscribes, for receiving newsletters, and for access to services provided through their portals or for the provision of other services offered on websites at the user's request or when their data is necessary for compliance with obligations arising from legal provisions. The eventual refusal to communicate to Impossible Target ASD certain data necessary for these purposes could result in the inability to provide services through its websites, the registration portals for events organized by the Association, or the photographic services provided during events, such as sending newsletters, providing information or printed material, sending industry news, providing assistance services, and properly fulfilling legal obligations. The failure to





communicate the data may constitute, depending on the circumstances, a legitimate and justified reason for Impossible Target ASD to not execute or to suspend the requested services. The communication to Impossible Target ASD of further data, different from the essential ones, for the fulfillment of its services is, however, optional and does not entail any consequences for the use of the services. Depending on the circumstances and if necessary, Impossible Target ASD will inform about the mandatory or optional nature of the communication of personal data. Impossible Target ASD will highlight the mandatory or optional nature of the communication of your data by placing a special character (*) next to the mandatory information or only the data necessary for the provision of its services.

6. Communication of personal data

Personal data may be made available to third parties that process the data independently, solely for the purpose of executing the operations described on the portals and applications of the Data Controller, as indicated in the above paragraph 3, and only when such purpose is not incompatible with the reasons for which the data was collected and subsequently processed, and in any case, in accordance with the law. The potential third-party partner companies, to which Impossible Target ASD will make available such data, are client companies of Impossible Target ASD, public bodies such as press offices of local authorities, tourist boards, websites and social platforms, media that, through the signing of appropriate contractual clauses, have provided adequate guarantees regarding the subsequent use of such data safely and for the purposes for which the data was obtained (requests for information, requests for quotes, etc.).

7. How we collect data on our portals

During the use and navigation of our portals, some personal data may be collected automatically (through so-called 'cookies'), such as, for example, the user's IP address and other information related to the user's stay on the websites or preferences expressed by the user in choosing the offered services. This information and data are collected directly and automatically by the website and as part of its own functioning. For further details on the functioning, please refer to the reading of the Cookie Policy.

8. Security

Impossible Target ASD has adopted security measures to minimize the risks of destruction or accidental loss of the data itself, unauthorized access, or improper or non-compliant processing with the stated collection purposes in our Privacy Policy. However, the Association cannot guarantee its users that the measures taken for the security of their web applications and the transmission of data and information completely limit or exclude any risk of unauthorized access or data leakage. We advise users to ensure that their computer is equipped with adequate software devices for protecting web browsing (such as updated antivirus, etc.) and that their Internet provider has adopted suitable measures for the security of data transmission online.

9. Registration of bank details

On web portals and applications, in case of payment by credit card, the necessary information for executing the transaction, such as the credit or debit card number, expiration date, and security code will be protected and managed by our systems to allow the purchase to be completed. The payment information and arrangements entered into the financial system (credit card number, security codes) are processed via the SSL (Secure Sockets Layer) protocol and will not be stored in any way on our systems.

10. Storage times

The data is stored for the time necessary to pursue the purposes indicated in this notice unless a longer retention period is required or permitted by law.

11. Rights of the interest party

At any time, the user may exercise, pursuant to Articles 15 to 22 of EU Regulation 2016/679, the following rights and obtain:

1. the confirmation of the existence or non-existence of personal data concerning him/her;
2. information regarding the source of his/her personal data;
3. information regarding the purpose and method of processing his/her personal data;
4. the identifying details of the data controller and the data processors;
5. the indication of the subjects or categories of subjects to whom personal data may be communicated or who may become aware of it as, for example, data processors;
6. where possible, information regarding the period of retention and obtaining limitations of processing;
7. data portability, that is, receiving it in an intelligible and machine-readable format;
8. the updating and rectification of his/her personal data;
9. the deletion of his/her personal data;
10. the unsubscribe from receiving our newsletters, via a specific link always present in the footer of all communications sent with his/her consent.
